Beyond the Book project: artefacts and ephemera

Please note that many of the items are copyright of the projects that created them, or of the authors and publishers.

Beyond the Book was a trans-Atlantic collaborative interdisciplinary research project that analysed mass reading events and the contemporary meanings of reading in the UK, the USA and Canada.

The project holds supporting materials from the events such as promotional flyers, posters and guides collected from nine reading events. There is a list of all items held by the project, and photographs of selected items.

The items were produced mostly between 2001 and 2007.
